It's tax time again... By P/C Tony Salzarulo, JN

Whether you struggle through your own taxes, or engage a paid preparer to help you out, don't forget the Power Squadron when compiling your information to complete your 1040 filings this year. The New London Power Squadron, is a unit of the United States Power Squadron and is a tax exempt organization under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Contributions made to the Power Squadron, locally or nationally qualify as a tax-deductible charitable contribution for those taxpayers who itemize deductions. Additionally, charitable contributions are not subject to the alternative minimum tax.

Your Power Squadron dues and uniforms are also deductible. Also, for those of you who travel to teach classes or participate in educational seminars, the mileage that you utilize your car for Power Squadron purposes is also deductible. For 2011, the charitable contribution mileage rate is 14 cents per mile. This would also be applicable to those of you who travel to executive board or district meetings. Out-of-pocket costs as they relate to Power Squadron activities are also deductible. I have attended two national meetings, one in Norfork Virginia and the other in Detroit and I deducted the cost of those trips including airfare, hotel, and meals (subject to limitations).

You can't deduct expenditures where you're receiving goods and services in return. For example, if you enroll in the navigation course and purchase books and materials you cannot deduct the cost of those materials. Taxpayers also frequently ask me if their time is deductible. Unfortunately, your time spent is never deductible.
